UNDERGRADUATE CURATORIAL INTERNSHIPS

Academic Year 2025–26

Block Museum of Art curatorial internships are open to Northwestern University undergraduate students from various academic disciplines and programs. The internships provide hands-on experience in an academic art museum and offer opportunities to learn about curatorial work. Projects may include work on collections and acquisitions, as well as exhibitions, programs, and publications with an emphasis on research and writing. Interns will be assigned independent and collaborative projects and will have opportunities to meet with staff members to learn about different museum careers.

Interns are paid \$15 per hour and can work up to 10 hours per week during the fall, winter, and spring quarters. Work may be scheduled throughout the academic year, between mid-September 2025 and June 2026. (Interns may vary the number of hours they work per quarter, depending on course load.)
